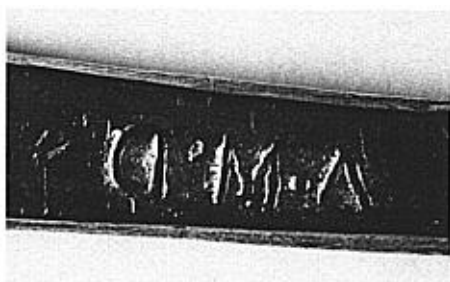

¹ Laughlin also attributes this eagle mark (LIL, Vol. I, 430a) to a relatively unknown Connecticut pewterer, I. Curtiss (active 1818-25), and suggests that the Boardmans later acquired the mark from Curtiss (see LIL, Vol. I, p. 136). This mark has also been faked.

² Joel Hall II, of Wallingford, Connecticut, filed a patent for an "improvement in casting spoons" from "block-tin or any other fusible metal or metals" on April 25, 1846.
